



Gecko Care Sheet



What do I feed my Gecko?

The best insects to feed your Leopard Gecko are crickets and mealworms.

How often do I feed my Gecko?

Baby Geckos should be fed 5-7 small crickets or mealworms every day until they reach about 4 inches. Larger food should be offered every other day until they become full grown in about 10-12 months. Adults can be fed 6-7 large crickets or mealworms 2 to 3 times a week.

Do Gecko's like to be held?

A leopard gecko is a very special pet. It is one of the few reptiles that enjoys being handled, but only if you do it right. If you mishandle your gecko, you could end up with a cranky or even vicious pet.

Can more than one Gecko live together?

A male and female gecko pair can live happily together in a single tank or enclosure. ... Multiple females can be kept together with a male, but multiple males should not be kept together, even with several females, since they will fight over territory.

Are Gecko's friendly?

These friendly creatures tend to be docile and easy to tame, as well as being easy to care for. Geckos are one of the most popular reptiles to be kept as pets - especially for beginners - and with good reason.

How often should I clean the tank?

About once every 2 months, take everything out, throw out the substrate, and scrub and disinfect the cage and all the items in it to help reduce the buildup of bacteria.

Keeping the tank clean will make sure your leopard geckos are healthy and happy.

Aquarium size?

For a baby or juvenile leopard gecko, a 10-gallon tank is sufficient. However, as they grow into their adult size, the average gecko will need an enclosure of at least 20 gallons or larger
